A quorum was present.

Agenda: Waggonner asked if there were any objections or modifications to the agenda. Hearing none, the agenda was approved.

Minutes:

Lindahl presented minutes from May 23, 2017.

Motion to approve Royal seconded by Smith. Motion was approved unanimously.

Treasurer's Report/Finance: None.

Community Forum/Open Discussion: None.

District 9 City Representatives/Business: Matt Yagyagon – reported community office hours will be held at the City Community Center in the Teen Room. Homeless Outreach Team was out along Fairmont Ave. The office has received numerous calls about no right turns at Adams Ave to the I-15 in Kensington.

San Diego Mayor's Representative's Report: Eric Young – Introduced himself to the group.

City of San Diego Representative's Report

Johnny Tully presented the June 27, 2017 report (attached).

Capital Projects:

Lindahl reported Iron Express has re-installed all the gates and that Ramona Paving has set the bulb-outs at for the giraffe style gates at Highland, Madison, and Adams Ave.

SANDAG Presentation and Report Re: Monroe/Meade Bike Plan:

Board Comments:

McCabe: Is 3 seconds enough time for a vehicle to stop when approaching the HAWK from the Kensington?

Mizzi: Is it appropriate to have a HAWK signal in an older historic neighborhood like Talmadge?

Swanson: Is there enough clearance?

Flores: Issues with sight lines coming up the hill.

Royal: There should be a dedicated left turn lane north bound at Euclid and El Cajon Blvd.
What's the anticipated speed of the cars in the roundabout?

Waggonner:

Lindahl: Concerned about traffic counts presented. Traffic will increase by 5k cars per day.
Not in favor of the presented plan.

Clark: Disagrees with page 18 of the plan. Capacity into the neighborhood cannot be increased.

Smith: Are we wasting these peoples time?

Judson: More work need to be done on this plan. Requests an all streets simulation for the next presentation.

Motion was made by Waggonner to adjourn the meeting – seconded by Clark. Motion was approved unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 9:00 PM

Traffic Circle:

- The plant material is healthy and doing fine.
- On June 16, 2017, the landscaped areas were weeded and cleaned.
- On June 20, 2017, the gates were cleaned.

“Hoover” Trees:

- Aztec Landscaping Inc. is providing landscape maintenance to the twenty-seven planted trees behind Hoover High School. The tree wells were weeded on June 20, 2017, and the trees are being watered once a week.

CIP Historical Gate Restoration:

- The Historical Gate Restoration project is progressing. Iron Express has re-installed all of the Historical gates and Ramona Paving has installed the protective bulb-outs for the Giraffe gates and completed most of the concrete work around the gates. The gate on the east side of Estrella Avenue still needs an electrical service which will require trenching and some of the other gates still need their luminaire whips connected and their photocells installed. Some of the gates also need touch up painting.

Other:

- **Illegal Dumps In Talmadge Alleys:** The Talmadge alleys were inspected on June 8th and 9th and service requests were issued to Environmental Services to remove the illegal dumps in the alleys.
- **Status of Damaged Street Light Pole at 4545 Monroe Avenue:** A ten foot Aegean concrete street light pole located at 4545 Monroe Avenue was damaged by a Lowe’s delivery truck on May 13, 2017. Street Division removed the light pole and made the wires safe. Street Division’s Supervisor, Mr. Derek Mack, has stated that he will have to order a new pole and luminaire for this site because he does not have this type of pole in their inventory. He further stated that he taking the lead on ordering the parts, providing the labor and equipment, and doing the cost recovery for this incident, since they are the service provider.

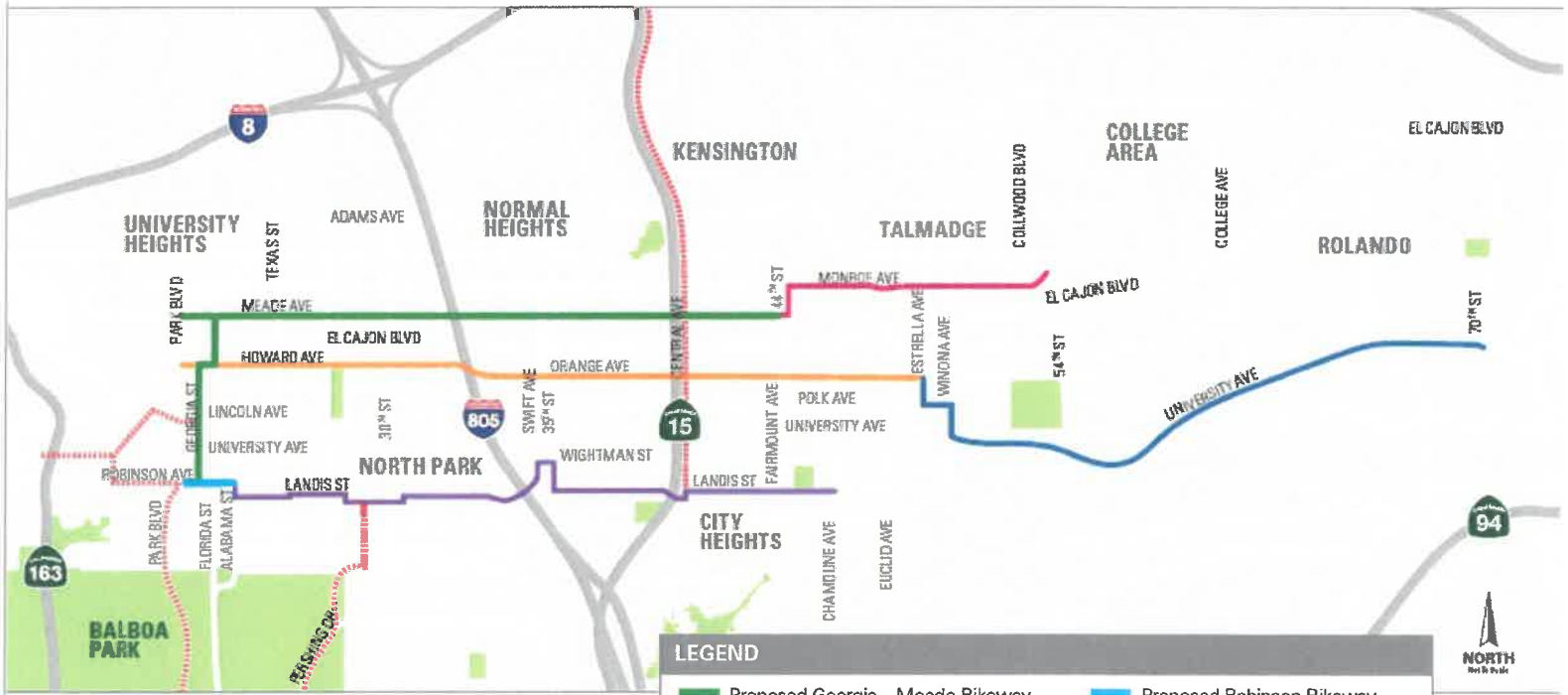

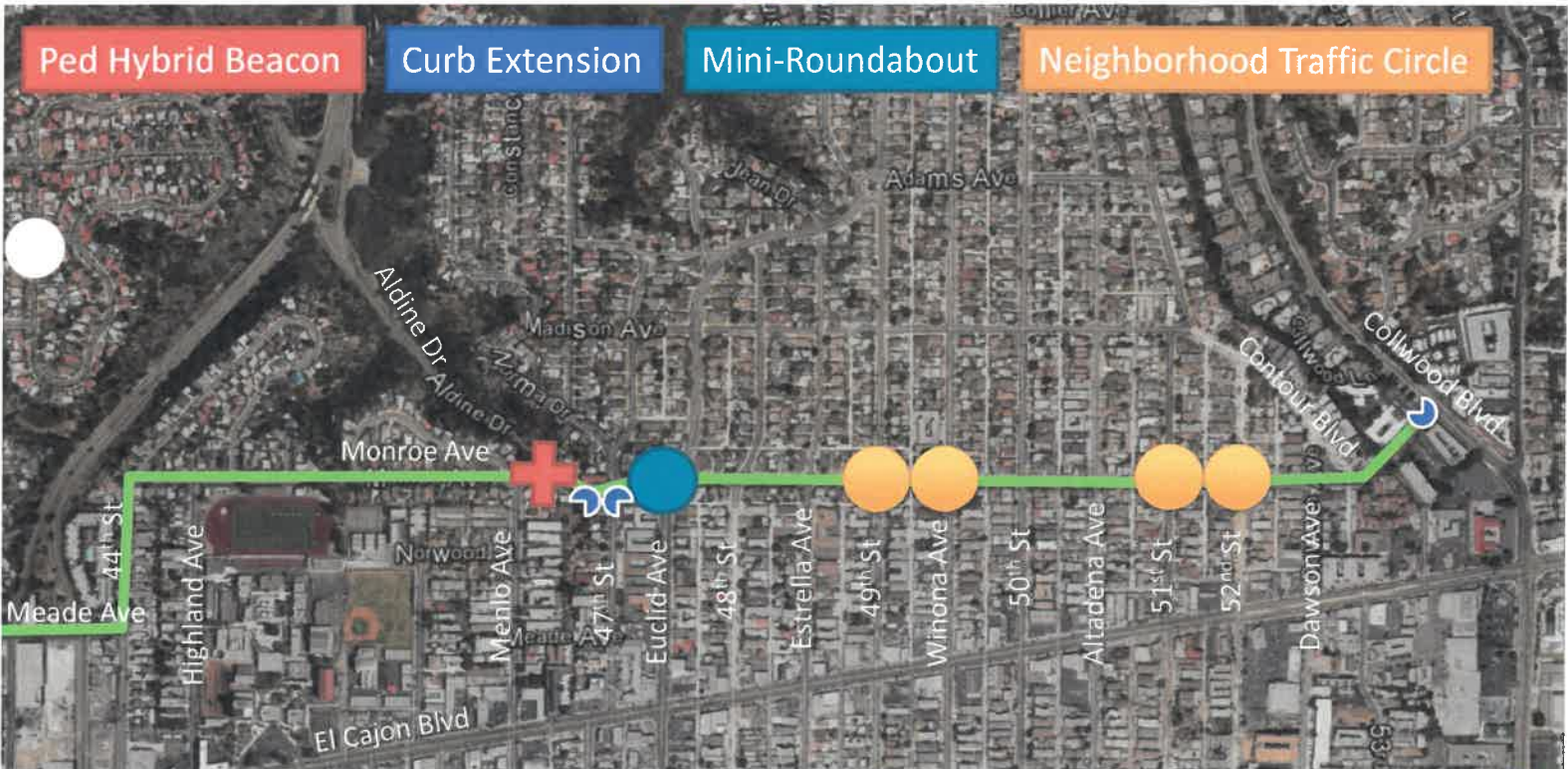

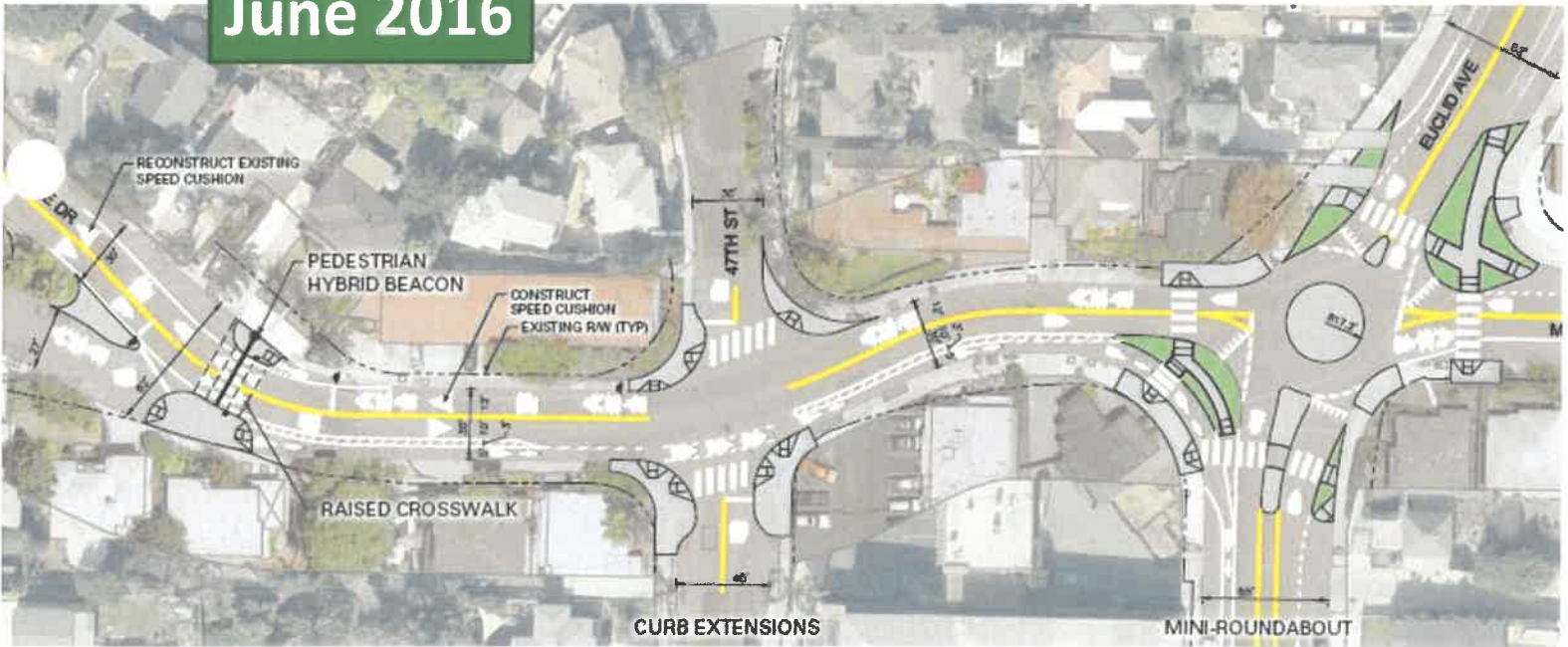

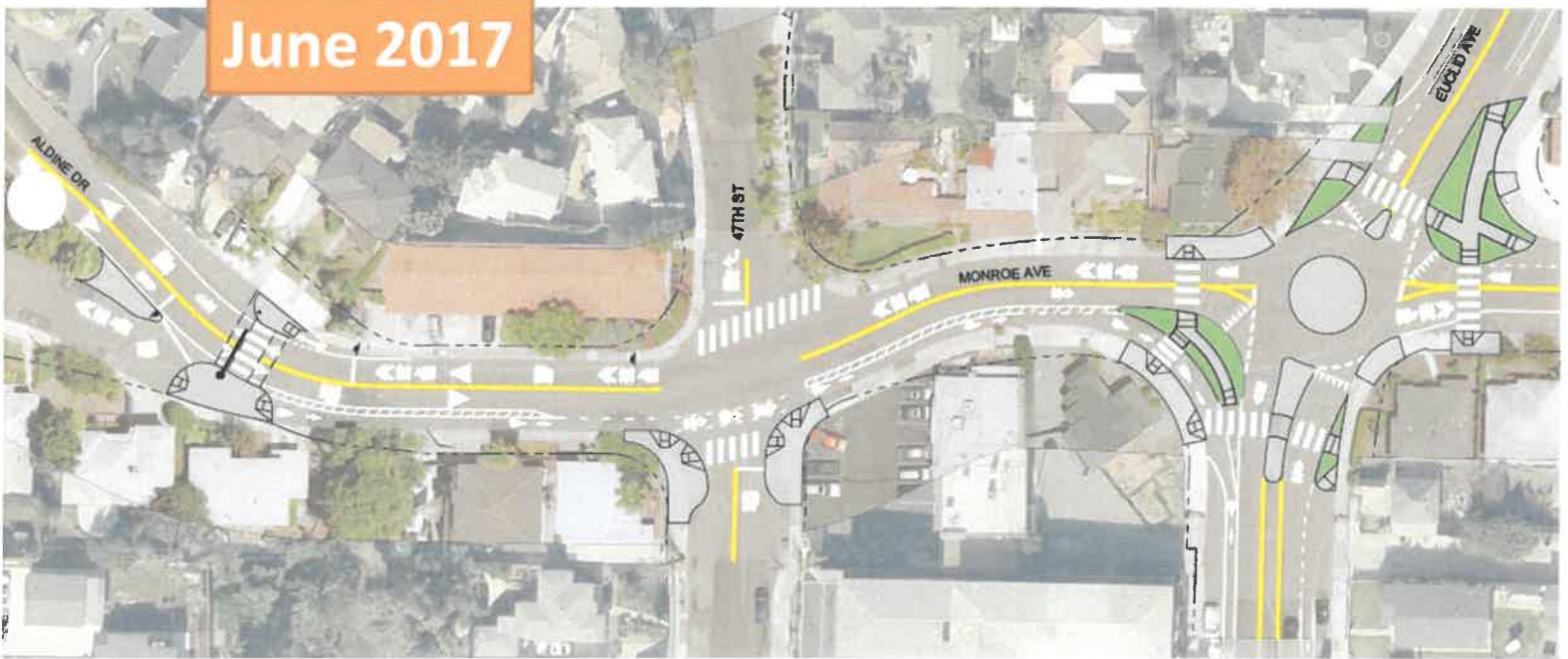

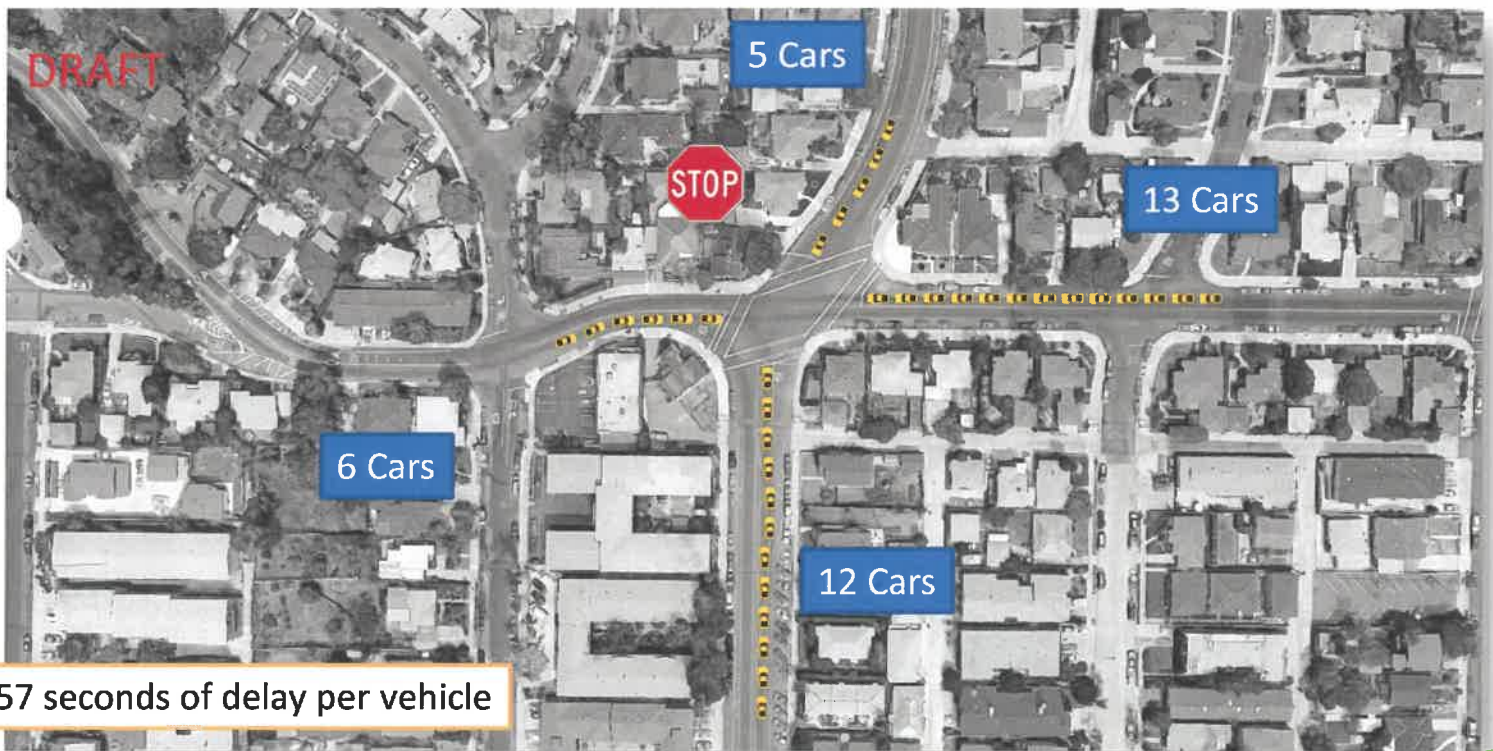

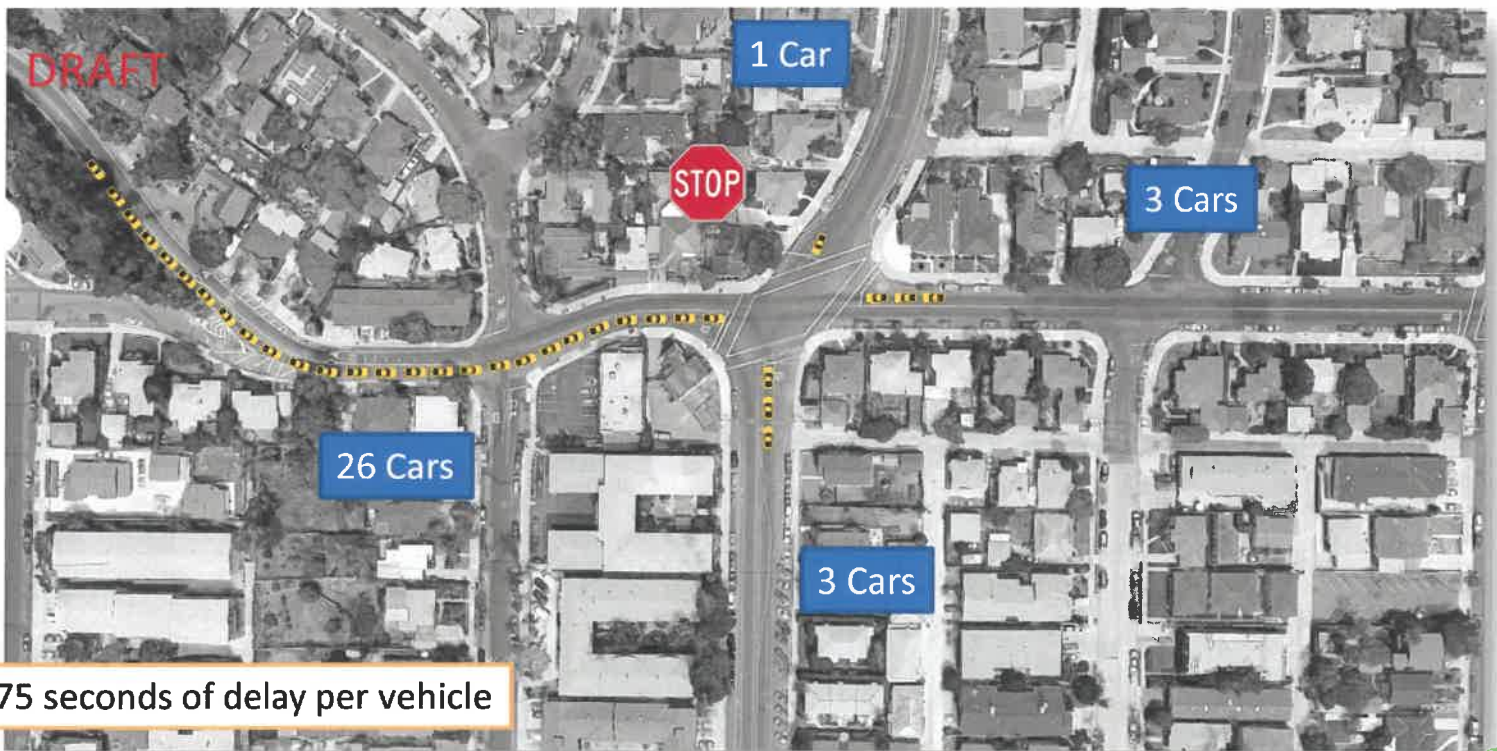
