- a. City Parks and Recreation Representative John Crago
 - Welcome from TMAD board; intros from board members
 - Report out Traffic circle plant material, Hoover trees in good shape;
 Street and Gate lighting all working with noted exceptions of 51st/Collier replacement globe (back order status), reported lights outages; Alley cleaning completed; tree trimming discussion
 - Ray spoke of funding increase for 2021 from \$5000 to \$7500
 - Swanson to provide address of 2 burnt out streetlights (Natalie and Norma)

Information Item:

Adams Ave & 49th St Splitter Island Project

• Installation of 3 cameras to monitor traffic flow during/after project completion; Cameras being considered as a 'concession' to increase of directional signage board members voiced concern(s) that Daniel Nutter, Senior Civil Engineer, will view the slightest traffic infraction as justification to install additional (extra) signage.

- Board members question underdeveloped, under-defined guidelines of driver & pedestrian behavior:
 - How long will cameras monitor? 1 month? 1 year?
 - What exactly is being monitored / viewed as infraction(s); based on what traffic count standards?
 - General feeling that the community concerns/voice have not been heard
 - What's the pass/fail criteria?
 - Proposal of 'protest' letter be sent to city officials with expression of disappointment
- Projected start of mid July with 2-3 month completion; "immediate vicinity" households to receive door hanger project information
- Cameras are to be adjusted to exclude yards and homes (privacy issues)

Action Items:

Talmadge Traffic Calming

- Drawings submitted (email) by Lindahl
- MUCH discussion, multiple concerns:
 - Original plan from KTU&A, with input from TMAD sub-committee, included landscaping & beautification current plans really deviate / have no 'Talmadge Touch'; modifications (exclusions) were not submitted to TMAD Board in advance
 - Lacking traffic flow / pedestrian flow Stop sign is set back too far; view minimized, Ramp placement(s) don't support foot traffic
 - Poor design of 'rock blanket'
 - Bulbout shape(s) very different
 - Concerns that the plan will have a detrimental neighborhood outcome; this project needs a positive outcome
- Overall desire is to sit down with City Works and coordinate with the water/storm project to achieve Talmadge enhancements (beautification), not eyesores
